## 6. CORRESPONDENCE

# 7. TO RECEIVE REPORTS FROM COMMITTEE CHAIRMEN

#### a) Planning

Approvals are received for 12 Millers Croft, 43 Barbers Drive and 31 Merchant Way. The application at 23 Temple Lane has been refused. The Report on the Ecopark should be ready by now, and will go to Committee on 27<sup>th</sup> September.

#### b) Roads and Footpaths

Cllr Stericker has had a further meeting with Angus Young. The dog bin at the end of the footpath Low Green/Recreation Centre is missing and will be replaced.

The dog bin purchased by the Parish Council is to go at the balancing pond. CYC will not charge us for emptying this.

The Manor Heath sign is being repaired and we have asked that the refuse bin and footpath/cycle path sign be replaced.

The No Through Road sign on Station Road is back in place.

Graffiti has been removed from a number of signs.

A notice regarding overgrowth will appear in the Newsletter.

Network Rail have cut back overgrowth along the railway line.

The Clerk has cut back overgrowth on the railway bridge.

# 12. PUBLIC TRANSPORT

The assessment re the 8.57 am bus is awaited. From April next year, Senior Citizens bus passes will not be valid until 9.30 am (9.00 am at present), and cannot be used after 11.30 pm.

There had been spillages of diesel by the school bus on the road in St Giles Way and School Lane yesterday morning. When reported to CYC these had been regarded as an emergency and quickly cleaned up. The Clerk to write to the bus company concerned.

We are informed that the "bus stop" in St Giles Way is not in fact a recognised stop.

## 13. PROFILE OF THE PARISH COUNCIL
