2. DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST

4. CLERK'S REPORT

Mr Dean has been instructed to carry out the works to trees in the burial ground, as agreed last month.

Mr Gospel has been asked to attend to the fence at the allotments.

5. NORTH YORKSHIRE POLICE MATTERS

A vehicle has been stolen from the Fox and Hounds car park. A number of bicycles have been stolen. A quantity of alcohol has been taken from youths on Back Lane, and Cllr Parker has seen evidence of drinking on Colton Lane.

6. WARD COMMITTEE

Cllr Healey is away on holiday. Cllr Gillies had nothing specific to report but left a plan showing the "Open Spaces" within the village for verification and return.

7. CORRESPONDENCE

Letters of thanks have been received from the Yorkshire Countrywomen and Copmanthorpe Scout Group for the recently allocated grant money. The YCA have increased their annual subscription to £10 per member.

Mr Terry Walker, CYC, informs us that there are no plans for a bus shelter on Horseman Lane.

The College apologises for the behaviour of certain of their students on the bus, stating that it believes this to be the first incidence of its kind. The bus company, First, also apologises and informs us that there is CCTV on the buses, but this is wiped after two weeks. However they will put an Inspector on the bus and see if this helps.

8. TO RECEIVE REPORTS FROM COMMITTEE CHAIRMEN

Planning

The application at 3 Horseman Avenue has been withdrawn. The application for change of use at the Newsagents from Retail (A1) to Retail/Café (A3) has been approved.

Roads and Footpaths

A formal request for a "Ducks" sign has been made, and York Pride will fund this.

The "Copmanthorpe" sign at the top of Manor Heath has been removed, and a new one ordered.

The 30 mph sign at the bottom of School Lane is loose.

CYC are to look again at the cycle way sign at the top of Manor Heath.

Twenty new trees and 80 metres of hedging have been planted on the new road, and a replacement rowan tree has been ordered for Low Green - (we still have the guard).

The dog bin on Flaxman Croft is now being emptied.

Road surface repairs are to be carried out at the junction of Merchant Way and Top Lane, and the footpath along Church Street is to be inspected.

The bollard at the shops has been damaged.

The request for the path from the burial ground to Back Lane to be designated a Public Right of Way is to be taken up by Alison Newbould at CYC.

Finance

9. SHOPPING CENTRE CAR PARK

Cllr Bowen had circulated a report on progress so far.

Advice has been received from CYC that it is not a requirement under the Road Traffic Regulation Act for CYC to be involved in this project. The Parish Council has the power, under Section 60, to use its money for provision of car parking. Cllr Mrs Winter PROPOSED that Cllrs Bowen, Mrs Stones, Stericker and herself Cllrs Bowen, form a Sub-Committee to research the matter and possibly Irwin, Stericker, meet with the owners, then report back to the Parish Council. 9. STREET LIGHTING IN MAIN STREET

Cllr Bowen had circulated a report on progress so far. We are now awaiting Report by Damon Copperthwaite, CYC, to CYC members.

10. AFFORDABLE HOUSING

Affordable Housing Schemes have to be a mix of rented and part purchase accommodation. It was agreed that we should only decide whether or not to carry out a survey once we have the answers to our questions to Carolyn Vaughan-Downes.

The Clerk and Cllr Mrs Stones are to attend a Workshop on Affordable Housing next Monday. Cllr Mrs Townsend PROPOSED that we should delay a decision until we have any new information from this. SECONDED by Cllr Waite. Seven IN FAVOUR. One AGAINST. ONE abstained.
