1. APOLOGIES

2. DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST AND DISPENSATIONS

3. CASUAL VACANCY

Mrs Margaret Miller has expressed an interest in being co-opted and is in attendance.

4. MINUTES OF THE MEETING held on 10th June 2014, having been previously circulated, were PROPOSED y Cllr Mrs Taylor as a true and correct record of that Meeting. SECONDED by Cllr Simpson. ALL IN FAVOUR.

5. OPEN FORUM

It was suggested that a mirror attached to the lamp post opposite the end of Station Road may help to alleviate the difficulty faced by drivers exiting onto Main Street/Moor Lane. It was AGREED that the Parish Council would approach CYC about this. Cllr West noted that the booster underground electricity cable currently being installed along the length of Moor Lane is exacerbating this problem.

6. RURAL WEST YORK

On behalf of two concerned residents the Clerk had requested that a Ward Councillor try to find out the current situation with regard to the property at 1 Drome Road and its occupant. Cllr Healey will seek information from Social Services and Building Control.

A number of complaints have been received about the standard of recent grass cutting in the village. Cllr Healey will try to find out why this is so, and what is being done to bring about an improvement.

The Further Sites Consultation is ongoing, until 16 July.

7. PUBLIC TRANSPORT LIAISON

Cllr Ms Saxton AGREED to take over the role of public transport and Park and Ride Liaison.

8. NORTH YORKSHIRE POLICE

A holding letter has been received from the Police Commissioner in response to a letter from the Parish Council Chairman regarding the recent high number of burglaries in the village.

The monthly report includes 3 incidences of theft of SatNavs from vehicles, as well as a number of shop-lifting offences.

9. CLERK'S REPORT

An email has been received from a resident of Whistlers Close regarding groups of boys playing football on the grassed area in front of her property, often until late into the evening. Balls are regularly kicked against her front door and windows., and she requests a No Ball Games Sign as a deterrent.
