Information has been obtained on vehicle speed indicator signs.

The Clerk has met with a representative of the British Trust for Conservation

Volunteers to discuss the planting of replacements for trees recently felled in the burial ground. The Clerk will also seek their help and advice on the balancing pond.

Clerk The occupant of 25 Farmers Way is concerned that trees in the adjacent play area are in need of pruning. The Clerk will contact CYC.

Clerk There are reports of fly tipping in Fairfax Croft.

5. NORTH YORKSHIRE POLICE MATTERS

The village is quiet. There have been 188 reported incidents over the past 12 months, of which 100 have related to anti-social behaviour. Only 2 burglaries have been reported this month, however there was a serious traffic accident at Manor Heath/Colton Lane crossroads last week.

We have received information about a vehicle speed indicator. The Unipart Dorman DF11 has been shown to be an ideal device for conducting before and after studies of traffic speeds which will provide visible evidence that effective measures are being taken to increase safety on our roads. The DF11 unit not only displays the speed of the vehicle travelling through the village, it also records the data to enable a full understanding of the speed issues at peak times. The device is designed to reinforce the message of fixed plate speed restriction signage - it reminds drivers of their speed, prompting them to alter their behaviour.

Based on information obtained by Cllr West, following an email to the Clerk, Cllr Bell PROPOSED that we purchase one DF11MCB Battery Powered unit (mains charging) at a cost of £2,289.40, plus one B20.20219 spare quick fix mounting plate at £54.00. SECONDED by Cllr Ms Little. ALL IN FAVOUR. Cllrs Bell and Mrs Taylor will install the sign, and other Cllrs agreed to take it in turns to move the sign to various locations around the village.

SECONDED by Cllr Bell. ALL IN FAVOUR. David Wilson Homes and Linden homes (part of Barratts) wish to build 350 houses over a period of 7-8 years on the land opposite Manor Heath, and 60 houses on land at the top of Moor Lane, opposite the burial ground. Shepherd Homes seek to build 125 homes over 4-5 years on land behind the Wilstrop Farm estate and Cllr around the burial ground. Whitfield
