5. CLERK'S REPORT

The Clerk has investigated a report of giant hogweed growing in the footpath leading from the bottom of Ploughmans Close to the railway line, and alongside the railway line at the bottom of Fletchers Croft. The plants appeared to have been sprayed and are now dead. However it was AGREED that residents should be asked, via the Newsletter and the website, to be on the lookout for these dangerous plants.

7. NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN

8. FOOTBRIDGE OVER THE RAILWAY LINE

The Parish Council, the Recreation Centre Committee and Cllr Carr have all requested that any new footbridge be sited closer to the Recreation Centre, rather than at the site being proposed by Network Rail. A response is awaited.

9. DRAFT LOCAL PLAN

Still in abeyance

10. RECREATION CENTRE

Cllr Whitfield's report had been circulated. The Carnival has made a profit of approx £11,000.

11. HEDGE AT BURIAL GROUND

Information on any funding available for the laying of the hedge is still awaited. Clerk

12. YOUTH CLUB and HOWELL HALL

The AGM had been held at the end of July. A shed is to be purchased to go at the rear of the Hall to give more storage space. There are currently 20 attendees, but more volunteers are desperately needed to run the sessions, which are currently being run by Jean Auton as Acting Leader. Kay Bailey, CYC, offered to try to get some help from CYC, and there may be help available from students at the College or the University.

13. PUBLIC TRANSPORT and PARK & RIDE

The new number 13 bus service is being run by Connexions. Buses run half hourly but there is no service on Sundays.

14. PUBLIC RIGHT OF WAY

It was AGREED that we should seek to have the field paths off Westfield Lane established as Public Rights of Way. Mr Tim Duffy has previously offered to help with this, and Cllr Liston will speak with him.

15. ALLOTMENTS

It was AGREED that the Parish Council would meet twice a year with the allotment holders, in March and October. The matter of the additional tap on Mr Northfield's plot, in place of the water tank, will be discussed at the meeting in two months time. The dates of these meetings will be placed in the Newsletter and on the notice boards at the allotment site.
