11. DRAFT LOCAL PLAN

New figures from the Office for National Statistics show that York will need to build only 450 houses per year, almost half as many as previously indicated. It is not yet clear how this will impact on the Local Plan.

12. RECREATION CENTRE

13. WARD COMMITTEE

There is still £9,000 available in the Ward budget. An application for funding has been received from a table tennis club which has recently relocated to the Recreation Centre from the Railway Institute. Applications will also be made by the Parish Council for the purchase and installation of a publically accessible defibrillator (to go on an external wall of the Howell Hall), and for the planting at Yorkfield Lane, between Low Green and Merchant Way.
