# 4. NORTH YORKSHIRE POLICE

The monthly report had been circulated. There has been a worrying increase in the number of burglaries in the village, but we are grateful for the notable

Work on the Data Protection Audit is ongoing.

The Clerk is endeavouring to find someone to repair the stile at the allotments. Clerk The website has been revamped, and it now looks better and is more secure.

# a) Planning

# b) Finance
