The new owner of the former Mace shop has been informed of the Parish Council's ownership of the mosaic on the external wall of the shop.

The old village name sign has yet to be affixed to the external wall of the Cllrs Duffy/ Howell Hall. Auton

No steps have yet been taken to begin the process of securing additional Clerk/ burial ground space. Also, in the burial ground, one of the memorial trees Cllr Kram has been lost, and should be replaced.

It was AGREED that the Clerk should suggest to him that he ask CYC if they would consider adopting, and therefore taking responsibility for, the car park.

An application for a grant of £3,500 towards the total cost of £17,000 to replace the floor in the Sports Hall has been received. Cllrs Duffy and Whitfield both declared an Interest as members of the Recreation Centre Management Committee. After a lengthy discussion Cllr Jarrett PROPOSED that the grant be awarded. SECONDED by Cllr Auton. Six votes in Favour, three Abstentions, therefore the Grant will be awarded.

Friends of Copmanthorpe Primary School

Further information regarding costs in support of an application for a grant of £6,000 towards the cost of a polytunnel for use by the children has been received and was discussed. However members had concerns about the longevity and sustainability of the project and the request was reluctantly REFUSED. Clerk

10. YORKFIELD LANE

Nothing to report at the present time.

11. TREE PLANTING

Cllr Kramm not present, however he and Cllrs Whitfield and Mrs Taylor have agreed where the trees might go, and consultation letters to be sent to affected residents have been prepared.

14. COPMANTHORPE WARD

City of York Council is to remain as a Single Unitary Council.

There has been no progress on the Draft Local Plan.

No reply has been received from the Governors of Askham Bryan College to the Clerk's letter, written on behalf of Copmanthorpe, Askham Richard and Askham Bryan, seeking to establish a better working relationship. If the anti-social behaviour problems experienced in Copmanthorpe earlier in the summer resume when the students return in the autumn, this matter will be revisited.

Repairs to Main Street will be carried out in September. Letters will be sent by CYC to affected properties and Copmanthorpe Motors, and the Parish Council will use its social media pages to underline the necessity for all vehicles Cllr Mrs to be moved off the road where repairs are to be carried out.
