Before the Meeting began a resident of Sawyers Crescent expressed his concerns about the proposal to site a 15 metre high telecommunications mast on land at the junction of Tadcaster Road and Top Lane. The Parish Council has had representations about this from a number of residents living in the vicinity of the proposed mast, and has made objections, and suggested alternative sites, to City of York Council Planning Department.

The resident also has concerns about significant cracks which have opened up in the footpath by his property. He was advised to report these to City of York Council. He also asked about progress to establish a Friends of the Burial Ground group. The Parish Council is hoping to promote this via the Village Newsletter.

5. NORTH YORKSHIRE POLICE

The monthly Report has been circulated. There has been one reported burglary and a few more minor incidents.

6. ACTION REVIEW

The illuminated name sign at the convenience store is still in place. However the new owner of the business has stated that he will be removing it, and also removing the cameras and signage relating to parking outside the shop.

7. REPORTS FROM COMMITTEE CHAIRMEN

a) Planning

The Parish Council's application for two notice boards is at last going through the system. Strong representations about the extension to the Old School Medical Centre (for reasons relating to parking and therefore highway safety) and to the proposed telecommunications mast at Top Lane/Tadcaster Road, have been submitted.

d) Allotments and Green Spaces

Community Payback is now in a position to carry out the previously discussed and agreed work to the area around Howell Hall, and also the refurbishment of some of the village benches. The Scout Group has established a rota for watering the garden area at the front of the Hall.

9. NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN

Cllrs Whitfield and Mrs Taylor need to meet with Mr Martin Pickard Cllrs and Mr Derek Bowen to discuss the latest amendments, and Mrs Taylor/ then to meet again with City of York Council officers. Whitfield

10. YORKFIELD LANE

A management plan is needed for the entire length of the Lane. The stall at the Carnival had been used to promote the proposed Friends of Yorkfield Lane group, and some interest had been shown.

11. PROPOSED CLOSURE OF RAILWAY CROSSING

Cllrs Auton and Smith will attend the meeting of the full City of York Council on 20th July, when this matter will be discussed. Cllr Kramm Auton/ will draft a presentation.

12. COMMUNITY SPEEDWATCH

It is still proving very difficult to get sufficient volunteers together at any one time, and quite a few volunteers seem to have fallen away.

13. COPMANTHORPE CARNIVAL

The new banners had looked effective, although the stall had not had many visitors.

The new gazebo is somewhat flimsy, and Cllr Smith will investigate the options for a sturdier one in due course.

Cllr Smith Cllr Smith had had a lengthy discussion with Julian Sturdy, MP on the proposed closure of the railway crossing, and the Parish Council's vision for Yorkfield Lane.

14. YORK ENVIRONMENT WEEK

This will take place from 21st September and is organised by the York Environment Forum. Cllr Kramm will ask the Scouts if they are interested in being involved with this, and will also speak to Oliver Kneen who had attended the February Parish Council meeting seeking support for a Social Enterprise Company – Step Lightly – which will cllr try to help restore natural habitats and encourage biodiversity.
