#### 2. **DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST and DISPENSATIONS**

#### 3. VILLAGE PHOTOGRAPHIC ARCHIVE

Mr Simon Bowen was invited to give further details of the two options he had previously put forward to make the village photographic archive accessible online. He recommended the second option, as it would require much less technical work. It would be a fully managed service, a hosted server, for an annual service fee of £350. There are approx. two thousand images to catalogue and upload, and this work will take some time and require some outside help.

The Chairman thanked Mr Bowen for his time and work on this project and after Mr Bowen had left the meeting, he PROPOSED that the second option (as recommended by Mr Bowen) be accepted, and a budget of £2,000 be set aside. ALL IN FAVOUR.

## d) Environment

It had been acknowledged that Horseman Meadow had been disappointing this year. A better mix of seeds is required, with more flowers and less grasses.

Quite a lot of allotments appear to be untended, and an inspection will be arranged. A number are unlet, and options for covering these with weed resistant membrane are being investigated. The cost will be approx. £60 per 100 sq metres.

Members were made aware of the York Environmental Festival. Cllr West will send a copy of the Copmanthorpe Heritage Walk to the organisers.

# 9. HORSEMAN MEADOW

It was agreed that lower growing plants, perennials not annuals, are needed. The Clerk will ask Brighter Gardens to cut it down and remove all cuttings in September/October. Bulbs will then be planted, to flower in the spring, and sow a wide selection of wildflower seeds for summer and autumn flowering. The Parish Council is content that this is a worthwhile initiative which it wishes to continue, but it needs to be managed annually.

#### 10. COPMANTHORPE WARD

The Mayor of York and North Yorkshire combined authority has allocated £200k towards work to develop Yorkfield Lane.

### 11. TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT IN THE VILLAGE CENTRE

The response received to our recent submission to CYC is disappointing. However we will continue to press for the installation of bollards on the footpath opposite the Royal Oak, and a date is being sought for a visit to the village by Peter Marsland, CYC Highway Regulation Department.

## 15. BLISTER PACK RECYCLING

Cllr Auton PROPOSED that a further 12 boxes be purchased for the Old School Medical Centre. SECONDED by Cllr Mrs Taylor. ALL IN FAVOUR. Clerk

Bishopthorpe PC if any of their members would like to join in with any such
visit, and if they will reconsider their previous decision not to contribute to the
costs of this project.

## 16. TADCASTER ROAD SITE

This site continues to be well managed, and the level of associated traffic seems to have reduced.

## 17. MOOR LANE SITE

There are a number of patches covering holes in the surface of Moor Lane. A staff member has been removed from the site after urinating against a neighbour's boundary.
